**COMPOSITION COMMENTS:** A mixture of colourants, resins, additives, and solvents.

#### 3 HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Highly flammable.  
Irritating to eyes.  
Repeated exposure may cause skin dryness or cracking.  
Vapours may cause drowsiness and dizziness.

#### 4 FIRST AID MEASURES

**GENERAL:** Get medical attention if any discomfort continues. Do not give victim anything to drink if he is unconscious.

**INHALATION:** Move the exposed person to fresh air at once. If breathing stops, provide artificial respiration. Keep the affected person warm and at rest. Get prompt medical attention.

**INGESTION:** DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING! Rinse mouth thoroughly with water and give large amounts of milk or water to people not unconscious. Provide rest, warmth and fresh air. Get medical attention immediately!

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<b>SKIN:</b>	Remove contaminated clothing. Wash the skin immediately with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists after washing.
<b>EYES:</b>	Promptly wash eyes with plenty of water while lifting the eye lids. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes and get medical attention.

### 5 FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

<b>EXTINGUISHING MEDIA:</b>	Fire can be extinguished using: Alcohol resistant foam. Carbon dioxide (CO2). Water spray, fog or mist. Powder.
<b>SPECIAL FIRE FIGHTING PROCEDURES:</b>	Avoid water in straight hose stream; will scatter and spread fire. Keep run-off water out of sewers and water sources. Dike for water control. Containers close to fire should be removed or cooled with water.
<b>UNUSUAL FIRE &amp; EXPLOSION HAZARDS:</b>	HIGHLY FLAMMABLE! Vapours may form explosive mixture with air at room temperature. Vapours are heavier than air and may spread near ground to sources of ignition. May travel considerable distance to source of ignition and flash back.

### 6 ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

<b>SPILL CLEANUP METHODS:</b>	Extinguish all ignition sources. Avoid sparks, flames, heat and smoking. Ventilate. Clean-up personnel should use respiratory and/or liquid contact protection. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Flush with plenty of water to clean spillage area.
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### 7 HANDLING AND STORAGE

<b>USAGE PRECAUTIONS:</b>	Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Static electricity and formation of sparks must be prevented. Avoid spilling, skin and eye contact. Ventilate well, avoid breathing vapours. Use approved respirator if air contamination is above accepted level. Risk of vapour concentration on the floor and in low lying areas. Contaminated rags and cloths must be put in fire proof containers for disposal.
<b>STORAGE PRECAUTIONS:</b>	Flammable/combustible - Keep away from oxidizers, heat and flames. Keep in cool, dry, ventilated storage and closed containers. May attack some plastics, rubber and coatings.
<b>STORAGE CRITERIA:</b>	Flammable liquid storage.

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<b>VENTILATION:</b>	Provide adequate general and local exhaust ventilation.

<b>PROTECTIVE GLOVES:</b>	Protective gloves must be used if there is a risk of direct contact or splash. Use protective gloves made of: Impermeable material.

<b>HAZARDOUS POLYMERIZATION:</b>	Will not polymerize.
<b>HAZARDOUS DECOMPOSITION PRODUCTS:</b>	Fire creates: Asphyxiating gases/vapours/fumes of: Carbon dioxide (CO <sub>2</sub> ). Carbon monoxide (CO). Nitrous gases (NO <sub>x</sub> ).

<b>INHALATION:</b>	High concentrations of vapours may irritate respiratory system and lead to headache, fatigue, nausea and vomiting. Drowsiness, dizziness, disorientation, vertigo.
<b>INGESTION:</b>	Liquid irritates mucous membranes and may cause abdominal pain if swallowed. Nausea, vomiting. Diarrhoea.
